

MEETING OF TICKHILL TOWN COUNCIL 27TH MAY 2025

45.25 CORRESPONDENCE (Appendix 3)

- Email from the Pageant Master with final details for those organising VE day celebrations. **RESOLVED** circulated to Cllr Cooper and publicised on social media, website and notice board.
- Multiple complaints have been received from concerned residents regarding the green space off Airedale being turned into a BMX track by a group of Youths. Residents also reported the activity to City of Doncaster Council who sent out their Neighbourhood Officer to visit the site. Wheelbarrow and various tools were removed by CDC and the Street Scene ground force team have been instructed to return the land to it's original state. **RESOLVED** letters will be sent to neighbouring residents to advice the correct procedure to report concerns and CDC have asked Tickhill Town Council to share the information via Facebook.
- A resident raised a concern about vehicles illegally parked on double yellow lines along Sunderland Street, which are obstructing visibility for drivers exiting Tithes Lane.
 RESOLVED The matter has been referred to the enforcement team at CDC. The resident has been provided with the appropriate contact details at CDC to report any future incidents. In accordance with GDPR, the resident has confirmed she is happy to be contacted by CDC regarding this issue.
- Telephone call 02/05/2025 from CDC advising they have been instructed to set up a stall in Tickhill to support VE 80 Day offering residents support. **RESOLVED** set aside space outside the library in front of the gates. Contacted Tickhill Community Library to update them.
- Telephone call 06/05/2025 to arrange collection of the Rawson Road Sign for renovation. **RESOLVED**
- Email communication from Tickhill Estfeld asking if Cllr Baz Cooper could attend the school assembly at 9:05am on 8th May to deliver a talk about VE Day. **RESOLVED** Cllr Cooper will be delivering the proclamation on the Buttercross but has offered to put the school in touch with the VC Trust to see if they can accommodate.
- Resident complaint about overgrown hedges on Common Lane, which are now causing such an obstruction to the footpath that school children are unable to use them and forced to venture into the road at certain points along the footpath. **RESOLVED**
- acknowledged receipt, forwarded to CDC and advised resident to report via the report it page on the CDC website
- Email complaint about illegal and inconsiderate parking on Wong Lane, causing a danger to school children. **RESOLVED** reported to CDC.

- Email request from a resident asking who to contact with regard to setting up a youth football camp on the recreational ground in the summer holidays. **RESOLVED** responded to resident with contact details for CDC.
- Intent notice of road closure Peastack Lane. This was communicated via Ward Cllr Greenhalgh the evening before the closure, despite the notice being dated a week prior.
 RESOLVED public informed and CDC asked to communicate directly for future intent notices.
- resident regarding safety concerns at 17 Wong Lane. After speaking with the resident to clarify their initial email, it has become clear that the core issue is not parking itself, but the manner in which a vehicle accesses the front garden of the property. The concern arises from vehicles mounting the kerb to park in the front garden, which sits significantly higher than the adjacent footpath and roadway. This route is regularly used by groups of children, under supervision, on their way to school. Due to the height difference between the garden and the footpath, there is limited visibility for drivers reversing or exiting the property. This creates a risk that children walking past may fall below the driver's line of sight, potentially putting them in danger. **RESOLVED** Reported to CDC enforcement
- Overdue reminder from CDC for Commercial rates for car park. Query submitted online on receipt of initial invoice. **RESOLVED** RFO to contact CDC again re query.
- Email from the solicitor acting for Tickhill Alpacas regarding Tickhill Town Council refusal of planning application 25/00377/FUL. **RESOLVED** circulated to council, request for a member to visit site
- Resident complaint via Ward Councillor. Residents neighbour is excessively feeding the birds and wild animals in their garden on All Hallows causing a health hazard and encouraging rats. Ward Councillor requested Clerk report to RSPCA **RESOLVED** Ward councillor to email full details
- Letter from Solicitors regarding Transfer of whole registered title of St Marys car park. Query on section 11 additional provisions. **RESOLVED** circulated to full council for discussion. Potential extraordinary meeting may be required.
- Phone call from gentleman who contacted previous Chair several weeks ago regarding renovating the Rawson Road sign FOC. **RESOLVED** agreed for him to come and collect at 6:30pm before the meeting starts on 27th.
- Intent notice of road closures Wilsic Lane 17th 18th June and High Street Wadworth 26th My for 5 days. **RESOLVED** forwarded for posting on notice board, website and social media
- Complaint about slow emptying basin in pavilion toilets and toilets not being flushed by hirers. RESOLVED email sent to hirers reminding them to leave the pavilion in a clean and tidy state ready for the next hirer and check toilets have been flushed by children before leaving the building. Will check basin on 27th when attending meeting to see if plumber required.
